The Nutting Girl

Fieldtown Jig (solo or multiple - no set)

| Preliminary notes |
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| All sidesteps in this dance description are "closed" steps. |
| This means that a dancer doing a Right sidestep is facing somewhat to the left, has the right foot stepping in front of the left foot, and is raising the right hand in front of their body (or slightly to their left) to show the hanky. (As with all things Morris, there is lots of individual variation in this step) |
| Nutting Girl can be done as a solo jig or double jig. Renegades and Kingsessing often dance with a first group and a second group taking turns gives us a chance to breathe. If multiple people are involved, the final chorus is danced in unison (often with hands on neighbors' shoulders on the hucklebacks). |
| Description |
| Start with hop-backs onto the Right foot. All figures start with Right foot. |
| 1st figure: 4 double-steps forward. Right sidestep, left sidestep, hop-backs |
| Chorus: Right sidestep forward, double-step, Left sidestep, double-step Right sidestep, Left sidestep, 4 huckle-backs 4 double-steps forward Right sidestep, Left sidestep, Right galley |
| 2nd figure: 4 Squash-Beetle capers Right sidestep, left sidestep, hop-backs |
| Chorus: as above |
| 3rd figure: 4 Upright Capers Right sidestep, left sidestep, hop-backs |
| Chorus: as above, ending with 4 plain capers. |
